# Honour Roll, Ontario Scholar, Silver Medalist 

## Criteria

## Grade 9, Grade 10, Grade 11

## Honour Roll - 80\%+

Honour Roll recipients are 80\%+ overall average based on the following criteria:

- 8 courses with an overall average in grade 9 and grade 10
- $\mathbf{7}$ courses with an overall average in grade 11


## Silver Medal - 90\%+

Silver Medalists are 90\%+ overall average based on the following criteria:

- 8 courses with an overall average in grade 9 and grade 10
- $\mathbf{7}$ courses with an overall average in grade 11


## General Criteria/Clarification

- All calculations for both Honour Roll and Silver Medalist awards will be based on any Ministry-approved course regardless of where or in what format it was earned
- Calculations will be based on all courses earned between September 1 and August 31 of current school year only. Grade level of courses is irrelevant.
- Courses may only be counted once against the calculation for Honour Roll and Silver Medalist. Ex. If a grade 11 Reach Ahead course was taken in grade 10 and was included in the calculation that earned the student designation as a
grade 10 Honour Roll recipient or Silver Medalist, then this course cannot be used again in the calculations the following year for these awards.
- Final averages will be rounded up to the first decimal. Ex. 79.6\% grade average will round up to $80 \%$ while a $\mathbf{7 9 . 2 \%}$ will not round up to $80 \%$.
- A student being honoured as a Silver Medalist will also meet the criteria that year for the Honour Roll.
- Multiple Cooperative Education (COOP) credits will be counted as individually earned credits. Ex. 3 credit COOP with a final grade of $90 \%$ will be counted 3 times in the overall average calculation


## Grade 12

## Honour Roll - 80\%+

Honour Roll recipients are 80\% overall average based on the following criteria:

- 6 courses with an overall average during the grade 12 school year


## General Criteria/Clarification for Honour Roll:

- All calculations will be based on any Ministry-approved course regardless of where or in what format it was earned
- Calculations will be based on all courses earned between September 1 and June $\mathbf{3 0}$ of current school year only. Grade level of courses is irrelevant.
- Courses may only be counted once against the calculation for Honour Roll
- Example: If a grade $\mathbf{1 2}$ Reach Ahead course was taken in grade 11 and was included in the calculation that earned the student recognition as a grade 11 Honour Roll or Silver Medalist, then this course cannot be used again in the calculations the following year for these awards.
- Final averages will be rounded up to the first decimal
- Example: $\mathbf{7 9 . 6 \%}$ grade average will round up to $\mathbf{8 0 \%}$ while $\mathbf{7 9 . 2 \%}$ will not round up to 80\%
- Multiple Cooperative Education (COOP) credits will be counted as individually earned credits
- Example: $\mathbf{3}$ credit COOP with a final grade of $90 \%$ will be counted 3 times in the overall average calculation


## Ontario Scholar - 80\%+

- Ontario Scholar recipients are $\mathbf{8 0 \% +}$ overall average based on the following criteria:
- $\mathbf{6}$ courses with an overall average in grade $\mathbf{1 2}$
- Student has been recommended for the OSSD
- Any Grade 12 U, U/C, C, E, O course approved by Ministry
- Any Cooperative Education (COOP) courses related to any of the above courses
- Any dual credit courses in college-delivered dual credit programs approved by the Ministry


## Silver Medalist - 90\%+

- Silver Medalists are 90\%+ overall average based on the following criteria:
- $\mathbf{6}$ courses with an overall average in grade 12
- Student has been recommended for the OSSD
- Any Grade 12 U, U/C, C, E, O course approved by Ministry
- Any COOP courses related to any of the above courses
- Any dual credit courses in college-delivered dual credit programs approved by the Ministry


## General Criteria/Clarification for Ontario Scholar/Silver Medalist:

- A student need not complete the courses in one school year in order to be designated an Ontario Scholar or Silver Medalist
- Final averages will be rounded up to the first decimal
- Example: $\mathbf{7 9 . 6 \%}$ grade average will round up to $\mathbf{8 0 \%}$ while a 79.2\% will not round up to $80 \%$
- A student being honoured as a Silver Medalist will also meet the criteria that year for Ontario Scholar
- All calculations for both Ontario Scholar and Silver Medalist awards will be based on any Ministry-approved course regardless of where or in what format it was earned
- A student previously designated an Ontario Scholar is not eligible for a second award
- Multiple Cooperative Education (COOP) credits will be counted as individually earned credits. Ex. 3 credit COOP with a final grade of $90 \%$ will be counted 3 times in the overall average calculation.
- A student designated an Ontario Scholar will receive an Ontario Scholar certificate
