- 30 credits including 18 Compulsory and 12 Electives
- Successful completion of the OSSLT/ OLC4O course
- Minimum 40 hours of Community Involvement
 - ☐ The must be completed no later than June 1st

Financial Aid & Student Awards

- Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)
- Bell High School Commencement Awards
- Scholarships (Non-repayable awards recognizing academic achievement)
 - Entrance Scholarships
 - "Prestige Scholarships
- Bursaries (Non-repayable awards for students in financial need)





- Designed to supplement the cost of education and living expenses
- Not a replacement for the financial resources you/your family are expected to contribute
- Funds are provided from Federal and Provincial governments
- Students must be a Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident or Protected Person
- ☐ Students must be taking at least 60% of a full course load
- Awarded based entirely on Financial Need



Calculated based on

"Allowable Costs" minus "Expected Resources" = OSAP amount

- ☐ Allowable costs include: tuition, compulsory fees, books/equipment, living costs, return travel, etc.
- Expected Resources include: student contribution (including income & savings), parental contribution

- Department and Subject Awards (Department selected)
- 2. Special Non Subject Awards
 - a. Teachers can put a students name forward for consideration
 - b. Students can advocate with their teacher (s) to have their name put forward

Scholarships



- Scholarships (Non-repayable awards recognizing academic achievement)
 - Entrance Scholarships
 - These will be automatically granted by program/institution
 - Based solely on overall average
 - "Prestige Scholarships
 - Applications for these are throughout the fall/early winter of your graduating year
 - Most deadlines will have passed at this point of the year

Bursaries



- Bursaries (Non-repayable awards for students in financial need)
 - Bursaries will be offered through the institution to which you will be attending
 - Please contact their Financial Aid Office for more information
- Always check with your parents place of employment for possible post-secondary Financial support
